Classroom Activities

Build an Engine Album

Materials: paper, colored pencils or markers, stapler.

Object: After researching train engines students will create an album of locomotive images; they will write brief train biographies to under the images. The goal of the activity is to have the students have a better understanding of the history of the engines.

Lesson steps:

- 1. Choose five or more railroad locomotives from a book or web site.
- 2. Using colored pencils, markers, or crayons, draw a detailed likeness of the locomotives.
- 3. Label the significant parts of the machine.
- 4. Below each drawing, write a brief description of the engine; include where and when it was manufactured; how it was powered; what part of the country or world it served; and what railway company used it.
- 5. Create a distinctive cover and title for the album then staple pages together.

Create a Lakota Language Dictionary

Materials: paper and pencil.

Object: Students will find the Lakota translation of a number of English words. Through language, the goal of the lesson is to learn more about Lakota culture.

Lesson steps:

- 1. Choose 25 or more English words of interest or that are commonly used.
- 2. Alphabetize the list.
- 3. Translate the English words into the closest Lakota equivalent using web and library resources.
