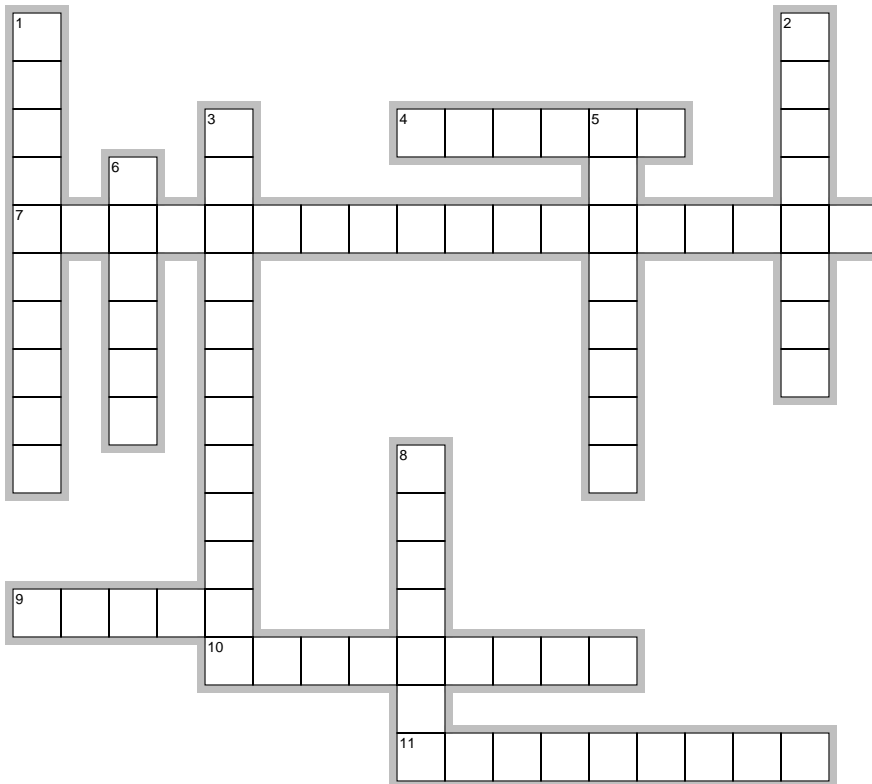


# Dakota Pathways: A History - Episode 12, Maps and Borders

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## Across

- the line or frontier area separating political divisions or geographic regions; boundary
- region W central U.S. between Mississippi River & the Rockies purchased 1803 from France area 885,000 square miles
- a large mammal of North America with brown fur, a thick full mane, small curved horns and hooves; common name is buffalo
- one that surveys
- a geographical area belonging to or under the jurisdiction of a governmental authority
- to determine and delineate the form, extent, and position of (as a tract of land) by taking linear and angular measurements and by applying the principles of geometry and trigonometry
- the season for gathering in agricultural crops

## Down

- a fundamental change in political organization; especially: the overthrow or renunciation of one government or ruler and the substitution of another by the governed
- a revolt; insurrection: an act or instance of revolting against civil authority or an established government
- a tract of land set apart by the federal government for a special purpose, especially one for the use of a Native American people
